



**Screaming Eagle Foundation
Scholarship Application Instructions**
Read and Understand All Instructions Before Completing the Application.

Objective

The objective of the 101st Airborne Division Association and Screaming Eagle Foundation scholarship program is to provide financial assistance to students who have the potential to become assets to our nation.

The major factors to be considered in the evaluation and rating of applicants are eligibility, career objectives, academic record, and insight gained from the letter requesting consideration and letters of recommendation.

AI & Willamary Viste Applicants - Preference will be given, but is not limited, to obtaining a degree in one of the physical sciences, medical or scientific research field.

Eligibility

- Applicant's parents, grandparents, husband or wife is (or if deceased, was) a regular or life member (not an associate member) of the 101st Airborne Division Association.
- Chappie Hall Scholarship - Applicant must maintain a 3.0 or better during the past school year.
- AI & Willamary Viste Scholarship - Applicant must maintain a minimum cumulative 3.75 or better (transcript required). Applicants must be either an upper classman (3rd or 4th year) or graduate student and enrolled in Medicine or a Science Degree Program.
- Applicant shall not be attending nor accepted as a student to the United States Military Academy, the Naval Academy or the Air Force Academy.

Application

- Applicants must complete the Screaming Eagle Foundation, "Application for Scholarship" Form and provide all required documentation.
- If qualified, students may apply for both the Chappie Hall and AI & Willamary Viste scholarships but will only receive one.
- Applicants may apply and receive an award each year for a maximum of four years for an undergraduate degree and two years for a graduate degree.

Required Documentation

A checklist of documents that are required to be submitted with the applicant's application is provided on page 2 of the Application for Scholarship Form. Applications that are missing *any* of the required documents will be rejected.

Submission

- All applications must be completed and submitted during the five-week application period. *Applications will not be accepted for any reason before or after the designated application period.*
- Application Period: **April 13, 2026 through June 19, 2026**
- Applications must be received *no later than* the close of business, 4pm Central Time on **Friday, June 19, 2025.**

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* If awarded a scholarship, the check will be mailed to the college/university's Financial Aid Office where you will be attending in the fall. The school determines how you will receive the funds.

Required Documents Checklist

NOTE: Failure to submit the following documents as described will result in the rejection of your application.

- Completed front side of form (Personal Information, Scholarship Election, School Information) .
- A "head and shoulders" photo of the applicant suitable for publication in "The Screaming Eagle" if the scholarship grant is awarded.
- An official transcript of school records.
 - We will only accept Official Transcripts signed and with a seal.
 - Must include grades for the current spring semester.
 - *Chappie Hall* – Four years of transcripts for High School students and all college transcripts for university students.
 - *AI & Willamary Viste* - include all post-secondary education.
 - Contact the Association office if you have trouble getting these.
- Letters of acceptance from a college or university.
 - Include this each year you apply; original acceptance letter may be re-used.
- Two letters of recommendation **written within the past 6 months** (from other than a relative) must be dated and signed.
 - *Chappie Hall* - one must be from a high school or college professor.
 - *AI & Willamary Viste* - one must be from a college or university professor.
- A typed personal letter (in letter format not bullet list) updated each year you apply. The applicant's letter will briefly discuss the following subjects in addition to others he or she considers relevant (AI & Willamary Viste applicant must also give a concise statement of long-term goals, to include post graduate educational and professional aspirations, following graduation):
 - Honors and AP classes (High school only), hobbies, interests, sports, community service, jobs, leadership experience and personal achievements.
 - Career objectives- near and long term.
 - Include the name of school, college, or university applicant plans to attend and why chosen each year you apply.
 - How a higher education for the applicant in his/her chosen field can benefit our nation.
- Original typed, single-spaced, essay on the indicated topic:
 - *Graduating High School Students* - "Patriotism." (Not less than 250 or more than 300 words.)
 - *Current College/University Students-* (Not less than 500 or more than 550 words.)
 - 2nd year student in College: The origin, composition, and role of the Electoral College*
 - 3rd year student in College: The history, composition, and purpose of the United States Supreme Court.*
 - 4th year student in College: The actions of 101st Airborne Division in Normandy on D Day 1944*
 - *Master/Doctorate Degrees:*
 - 1st year: Discuss the future of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and its possible influence/effects on US society*
 - 2nd year: Discuss the history, composition, role and operations of the Federal Reserve in the US economy.*

Certification
